 I give and bequeath to my son Rador the Land and plantation whereon now
 live to him and his heirs for ever
 I give and bequeath to my son Francis the Indian fields with all the Land on the same side
 of the branch to him and his heirs for ever
 I give and bequeath to my son William the remaining part of that
 Land on the upper side of the branch to him and his heirs for ever
 I give and bequeath to my son Roger the plantation whereon first lived in Johnston
 County with all the Lands belongs to the same to him and his heirs for ever
 I give and bequeath to my son Well and Josier that all the rest of my Estates of all kinds
 goods and Chattells may be Equally divided amongst all my Children
